| 1. Introduction Introduce yourself. State who you are, where you are from, and why you are there. |
| 2. Get the story Ask questions to learn what the worker cares about. Make your questions open-ended. React to what they tell you, agitate and ask follow-up questions. Help the other person feel they have permission to be angry. |
| 3. Vision message plan to win Create a vision of the union, the individual is powerless vs. collective power. |
| 4. Inoculation |
| Prepare workers for what the boss may do and say to fight their efforts to organize. We may also inoculate them on such things as another union or antiunion coalitions. |

5. Assess and move to action

Ask the worker to be part of the solution by taking a specific action. <u>Action Examples:</u> Sign a card, contact other workers, house visit with organizers, sign a petition, give a picture and quote for literature. Then agree on a follow up time and date to see how they did their assignment.
